If you want to say that a building or a place is beautiful, you can express your thoughts more beautifully than the word "beautiful" through the words listed above. For example, majestic monuments or breathtaking scenery. It can be seen that synonyms in English differ not only in terms of whether they have a negative or positive connotation, but also in terms of degree.

Turning to other cases, we can observe a kind of synonymy between proverbs in English. The meaning of proverbs like "No pain - no gain" and "Rome wasn't built in a day" are very close to each other, i.e. you can't achieve your goal without difficulty or nothing happens by itself.
